## Diarrhoea and Vomiting in Schools

Public Health England (South East) have issued updated guidance in managing outbreaks of diarrhoea and vomiting. Pupils suffering symptoms must be excluded from school until they have been **without symptoms for 48 hours consecutively**. This will help prevent and control the impact of outbreaks, particularly highly infectious norovirus, in schools.

The exclusion reminder comes from Public Health England (South East) in light of reports that children have returned to school after 24 hours. It is possible that the 48 hour rule has been misinterpreted to mean 48 hours absence rather than 48 hours *symptom free*.

## The Hampshire County Council School Crossing Patrol

**Service** currently has a large team of dedicated community-minded men and women carrying out the important role of ensuring the safety of children on their way to and from school.

There is currently a permanent vacancy at Milton Road, Waterlooville. - Patrol working hours are up to one hour in the morning and one hour in the afternoon during school term-time
- A uniform is provided to protect you against the elements
- Starting salary is £9.36 per hour
- The post is subject to a medical declaration, two references and an Enhanced Disclosure & Barring Service (DBS) check
