## **GOOD POINTS**

- 1. Unlike other versions of Call of Duty, you can turn the gore and a lot of the violence in the game off. Although fundamentally you are 'shooting to kill'.
- 2. It is free to play with no adverts; it has a similar feel to Fortnite.
- 3. Because of how big the map is and how long each 'round' takes, some parents have found their children LESS addicted to this game compared to others.
- 4. There are a lot of parental control settings within the game, which is unusual for this type of game.



## **BAD POINTS**

- 1. The aim of the game is to shoot and kill your opponent, for younger users this can be a disturbing game to give your child. Even with all the violence and gore you can possibly remove.
- 2. There is always the risk of encountering online strangers, as you are teamed up upon entry into the game and this can be with random players.
- 3. You may find your child can download this without your knowledge, making it important to keep an eye on what they are doing.
