Maintain a safe, well organised and stimulating learning environment Manage and direct the work of any additional support staff allocated to your class or group

Work closely with your year team partner to ensure consistency and planning that meets the needs of all learners

Communicate effectively and form positive relationships with a range of stakeholders – staff, pupils, parents, governors and the wider community Develop creative approaches to teaching curriculum content Be involved in and/or responsible for developing the curriculum in a designated subject or area – depending on stage of career
