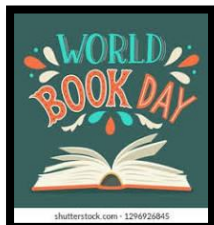

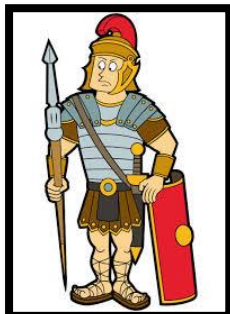

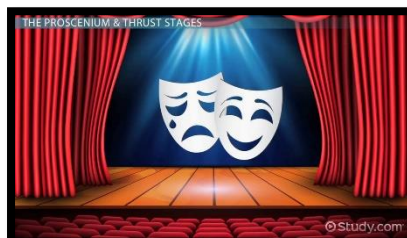


Year 4 Visit to Chichester Festival Theatre
