Recycling in Schools: Preparing for the UK's 2025 Legislation

From 31st March 2025, the UK will implement new, simplified recycling legislation designed to improve waste management and ensure greater consistency across the country. This legislation will have a significant impact on schools, requiring us to adapt our waste management practices to comply with the new standards.

We need to inform our parents about the upcoming changes and highlight the environmental benefits of proper recycling and the positive impact it can have, such as reducing landfill waste and conserving resources. We must take pride in being part of the solution!

Going forward, we will be separating our waste even further, and this means that our food waste will be separated to prevent it from ending up in landfill. In the future, food waste will be channelled towards becoming energy and bio-fertilisers.

In the meantime, we will be asking that the children take home any uneaten packed lunch, including packaging, i.e. cling film and foil. On another note, this will give our parents the opportunity to see exactly what their child has or has not eaten each day.

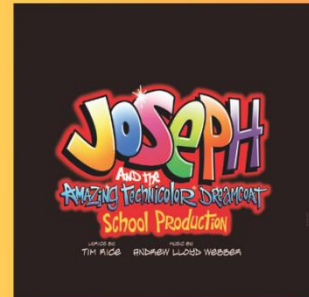

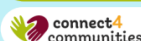
Hampshire HAF Schemes
