

Experiences

This term, the children will take part in a chocolate workshop where they will have the opportunity to make their own pizzas. Also, they will take part in a Roald Dahl experience focussing on language and a science workshop about light.



Computing

In Computing, the children will be looking at branching databases. They will look at how to separate items, thinking carefully about their questioning. They then will create their own branching database.

Physical Education

In PE, the children will be learning the skills for tennis. They will also get the opportunity to play cricket next term, with Chance to Shine.



English

In English, the children are reading the story of Charlie and the Chocolate Factory by Roald Dahl. They will be writing their own character description. After this, they will move on to the story of Malala, where they will write a diary entry, inspired by the story.



Personal Development

In PDL, the children will look at what constitutes a healthy diet and understand about personal hygiene, germs, bacteria and viruses, how they are spread and the importance of handwashing.



Religious Education

In RE, the children will be exploring the concept of ritual within their own lives and the religion of Judaism.



Y3 Curriculum Overview

Summer 1

Maths

In maths, the children will continue to enhance their knowledge of the 2,4 and 8 times tables. Also, they will be learning about non-unit and unit fractions and developing their understanding of column addition and subtraction.



D&T

This half term, children will be designing and making their own packaging for chocolate. They will look at a variety of current packaging, make different boxes, before designing and creating their own.



Geography

This term, the children will be learning about fair trade. They will look at where chocolate comes from and understand the importance of the relationship between the producer and the consumer.



Science

This term, the children will be learning about plants, where the children will be cutting up and labelling parts of plants and looking at what conditions they need to survive.



French

In French, the children are learning how to say types of fruit in French, the difference between singular fruit and plural of the fruit. Then, they are learning to say which fruits they like and dislike.
