### School Disco

We will be holding a disco for the children on **Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> October 2025**. This disco will be run by a professional DJ!

- Years 3 and 4 are invited to attend from 5.45pm until 6.30pm and is priced at £2.00.
- Years 5 and 6 are invited between 6.30pm and 7.30pm and is priced at £2.50.

We will not be issuing tickets on this occasion, however, by paying the required amount and completing the permission form through ScoPay you will be securing a place for your child. Staff will have a list of those children who have paid and will know who to expect on the evening. **We regret that we will not be able to accept last-minute children on the evening because of strict fire regulations regarding numbers.**

Please note that refreshments are included in the price so your child does not have to bring any money to the disco. No chewing gum is allowed in school during this event. For safety and security reasons children should not bring mobile phones.

As the disco is just prior to Halloween, which falls in the half term break, children are permitted to wear fancy-dress if they choose (it is optional!) However, please may we request that no masks are worn and that costumes are not too scary or gruesome!

Please ensure footwear is appropriate. Heels should be no higher than 6cm with a broad square heel of at least 3 x 3 cm. Please avoid sharp edges to the heels as these deeply gouge the hall floor.

At the start, please drop your child at the FRONT of the school via the reception door where a register will be taken. However, when you collect your child, please collect them from the BACK playground. We will dismiss the children once their adult is visible. Children are not permitted to walk home alone. If another adult is collecting your child on your behalf, please let Miss Jones know when you drop them off.

Children who are not well enough to go to school that day will not be considered fit enough to go to a disco that evening. It is also assumed their behaviour in school has been appropriate preceding the event.
